Making The Most of Your Visit

Understand that people with Alzheimer's may not recognize you. There's no need to put it to the test by saying this very common phrase: "My name is Helen. Do you remember me?" If you are sensing they are wondering who you are, simply introduce yourself by your first name and visit as a friend or a stranger.

"Hi. What a long day! Would you mind if I sit down?"
"You look comfortable. May I join you?"
"Hello, I brought you some ice cream. Would you help me eat it?"

What triggers their memory is not what we say, but what we put in their hands.

- Something to share: a flower, pictures, a present
- Something to smirk over: a letter, old pictures, jokes
- Something to nibble: fruit, snacks, ice cream
- Something to play with: bubbles, balloon, bouncy ball
- Something to hear: birds singing, favorite song, child's voice
- Something to smell: lilacs, cinnamon rolls, lotion

Family heirlooms and keepsakes are irreplaceable. If you leave them in a memory care community, they may be misplaced. Create a moment of joy by bringing them with you when you visit and take them home again. And bringing something isn't always required. If you didn't bring something, take the pressure off by talking in ways that doesn't require a response.

"This weekend I went to..."

"You're such a good mom because..."

"When I was a kid we used to..."

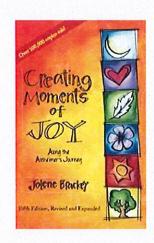

Caregiver Support



Stephanie Leanes, Director of Caregiver Support, has been with the organization for over 14 years. Stephanie graduated from Northern Michigan University with a degree in social work with a focus in gerontology. She has worked with seniors with various forms of dementia as well as behavioral challenges for over 25 years. Stephanie's primary role within the organization is to

provide support, resources, education, and opportunities for respite for caregivers. Stephanie is also a certified PAC Independent Consultant with training by Teepa Snow. Prior to her current role, Stephanie was the administrator of memory care at the Lutheran Home and was very involved in the strategic planning for Elaine's Hope.

What does this mean for you? Stephanie is part of the ancillary staff of Elaine's Hope and is available to support you, whether it be coping with loss and grief associated with this disease, or just finding resources for you. Her door is always open.

Stephanie also facilitates two support groups every month through the Alzheimer's Association. The group meets at the Lutheran Home every third Monday of the month with a morning and afternoon group. Flyers are available at the check-in kiosk at Elaine's Hope.

In addition to her caregiver support role, she oversees the adult day center and early memory loss program which serves as respite opportunities for caregivers.

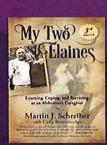
